## COLORADO COMPUTER CENTERS: BRIDGING COLORADO'S GREAT DIGITAL DIVIDE

Through a **\$3.3M**, two year project that ended in March 2013, the Colorado State Library oversaw the installation of **88** new and enhanced Public Computer Centers (PCCs) throughout Colorado. These PCCs provide internet access and computer training to foster broadband adoption. In 2012, the Library Research Service surveyed more than **7,300** PCC users to determine **the impacts the PCCs are having on their lives.** 

## PUBLIC COMPUTER CENTER USER PROFILE

Who is using the PCC during open lab time?

1 in 3 are job seekers

3 in 5 have no regular computer access outside the PCC

1 in 4 are ages 55+

Top outcomes of open lab users:

**52%** communicated with someone

**38%** looked for employment

33% used the printer, scanner, or fax

Who is taking computer classes?

1 in 4 are job seekers

1 in 5 have no regular computer access outside the PCC

3 in 5 are ages 55+

Top outcomes of computer class attendees:

68% got better at using a computer

**49%** got better at using the internet

38% got better at using software
