2025 Fast Facts

The Colorado Historic Newspapers Collection (CHNC) provides free access to more than 7.5 million digitized pages from over 945 individual newspaper titles published in Colorado from 1859 to 2025 allowing users from across the globe to "experience Colorado as it happened".

Quick Stats

- Nearly 2.4 million pages were added in 2025!
- 7 languages represented including English, German, Italian, Japanese, Slovenian, Spanish, and Swedish.
- Over 278 individual and organizational contributors assist with content, funding, or text correction.
- There were 5.9 million page views in 2025.

Total Pages by Year

The following table lays out the total pages for each year between 2010 to 2026. Over 3 million more pages have been added since we reached the milestone of 4 million pages in 2024! Note that the totals were reported at different times throughout the year.

- There were 467 thousand users in 2025.
- 13 page views on average per user.
- About 5 minutes of engagement per user on average.
- CHNC is accessed through mobile devices (51% of users), desktop computers (47% of users), tablets (2% of users) and smart TV (less than 1% of users.)
