

State Grants to Libraries

FY 25-26 Allocations

In 2025, the Colorado Legislature appropriated nearly \$3 million in the state's budget to fund the State Grants to Libraries Act.

313 Colorado libraries received FY25-26 State Grants to Libraries funding. That's 95% of public libraries, 96% of academic libraries, 98% of school libraries, and 100% of state institutions.

106 libraries at least doubled their collections budget with these grant funds!
