In 2025, **the number of job postings declined more than 13%** from 2024, but the number of site views and users added in 2025 continued to increase.

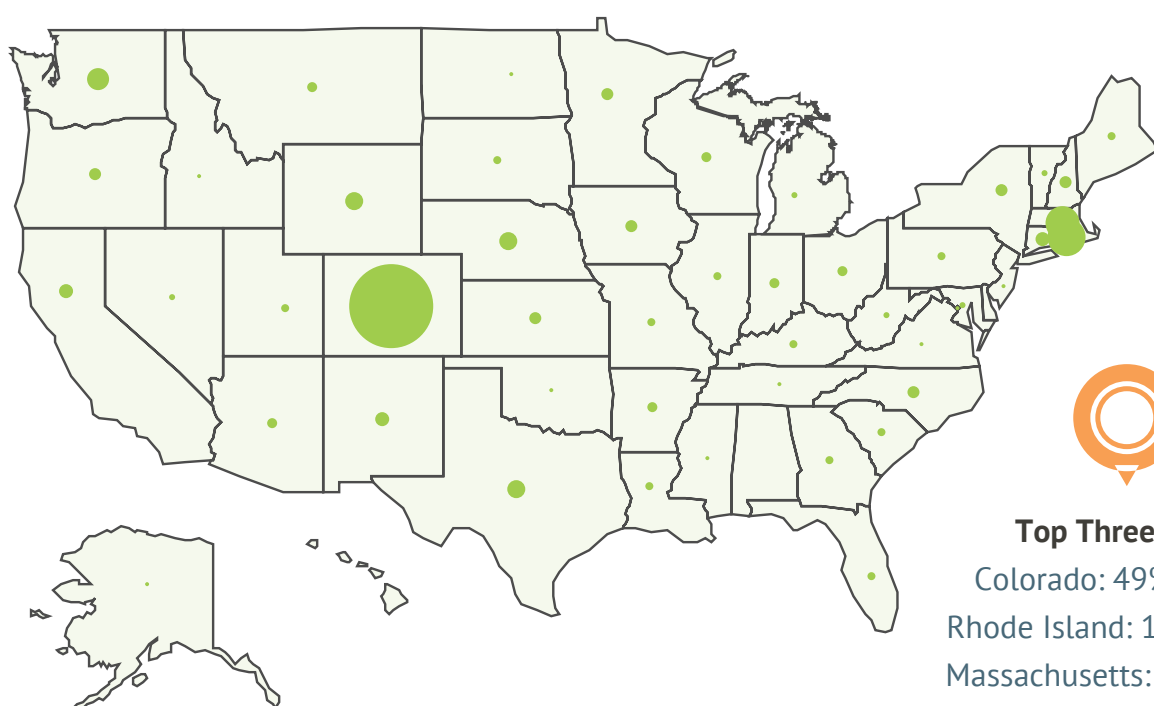

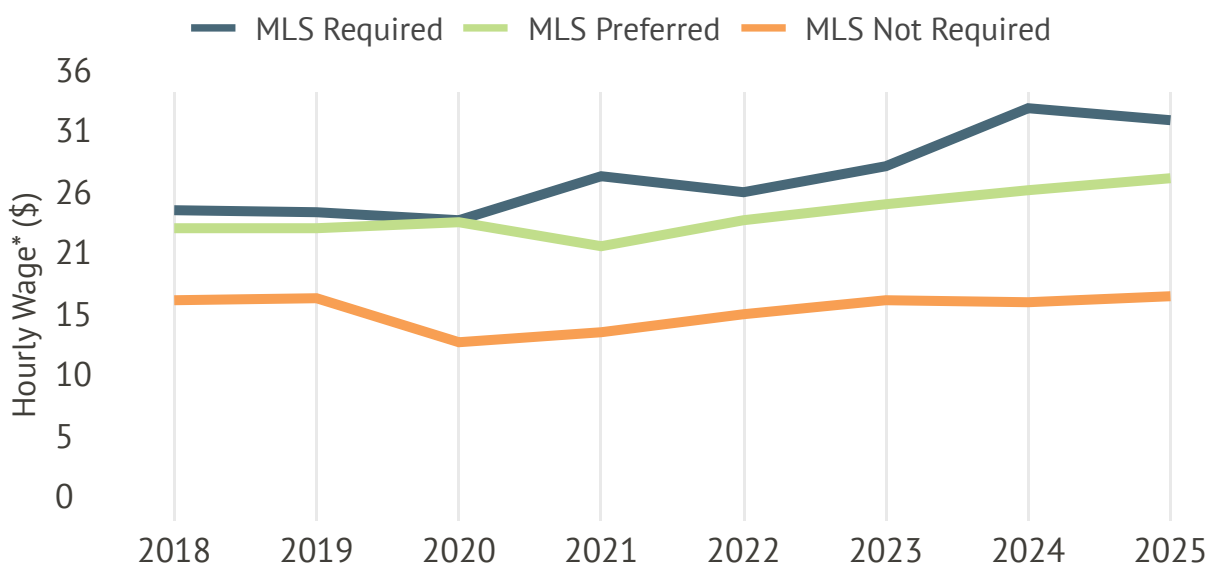

## Average Salaries Over the Years

Average salaries increased for positions posted that preferred or do not require an MLS/MLIS degree. After rising the year before, average salaries for positions posted that require an MLS degree dropped slightly in 2025 but stayed above the 2023 average.

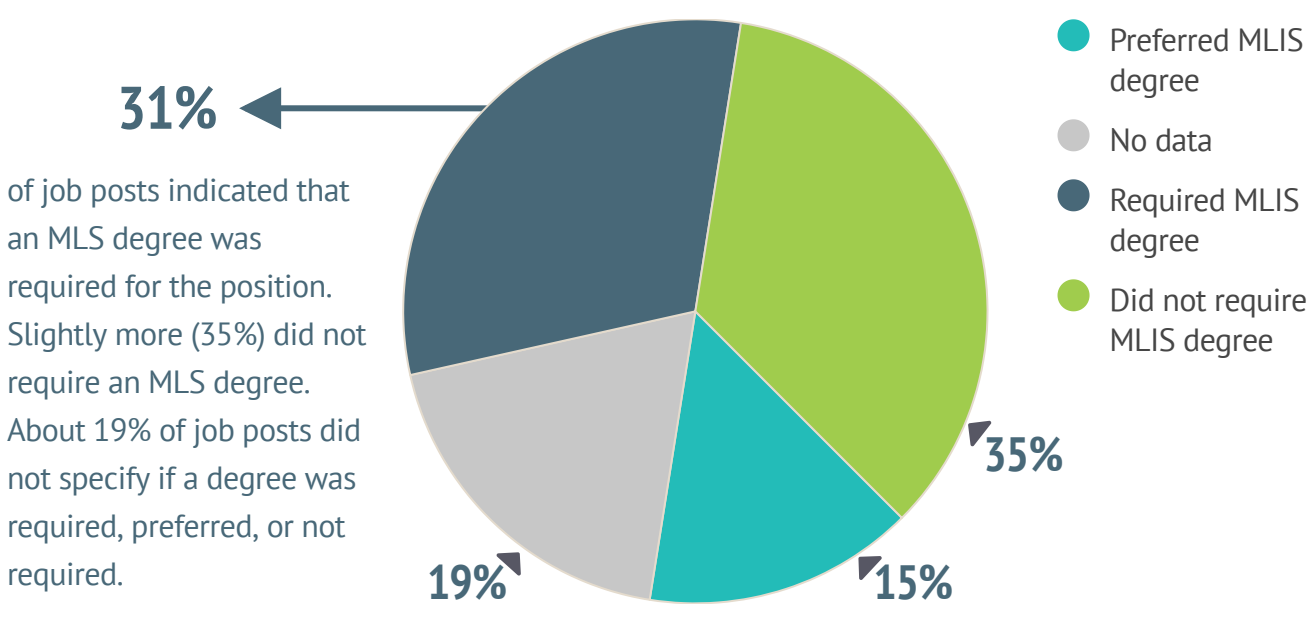

## New Job Seekers Outnumbered New Employers in 2025

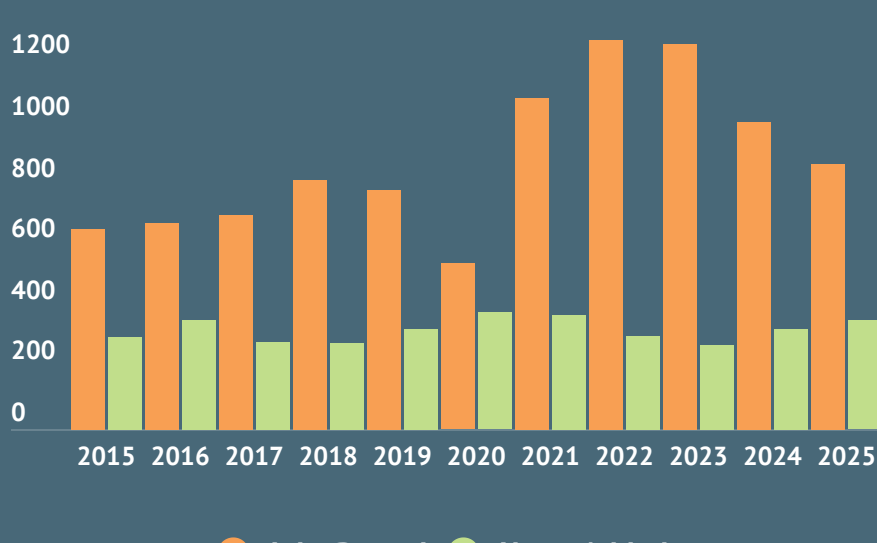

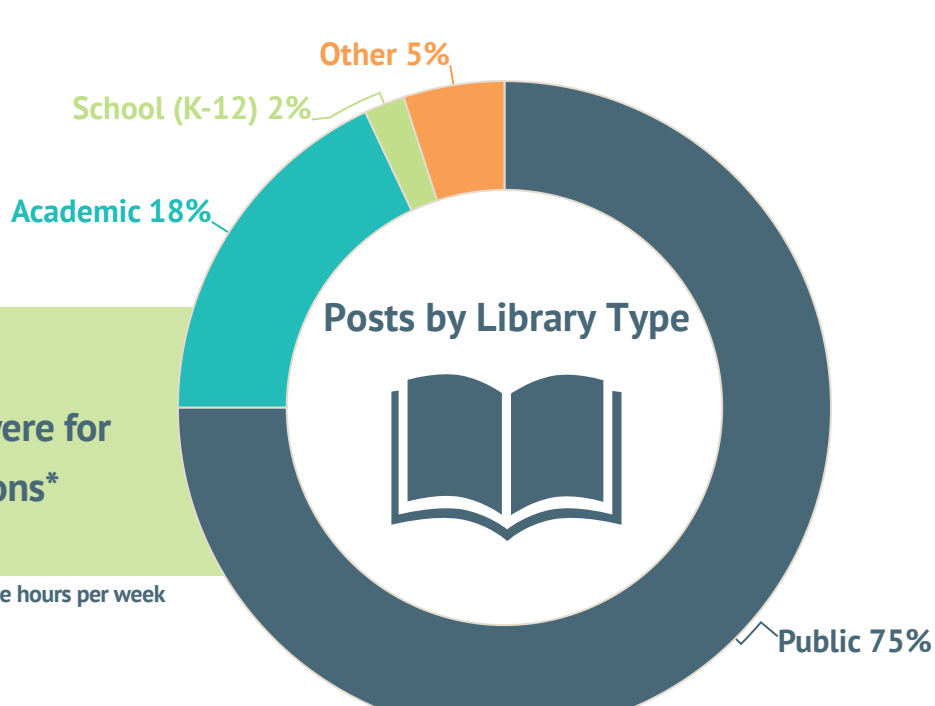
## The Number of Jobs Posted and Users Added Over the Years

The number of job postings on Library Jobline continued to drop but still remained above pre-pandemic numbers. New users increased slightly from 2024 but has generally fluctuated little over the past 11 years.

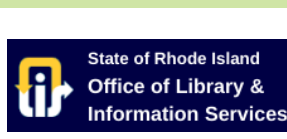
